The B.S./M.S. in Finance puts students on the fast-track to a successful career in Finance. Undergraduates majoring in Finance and STEM-related majors can complete up to two M.S. in Finance courses (six credits) that will count towards both their bachelor's and master's degree, accelerating their path to the graduate degree and saving tuition along the way. Students may take two of the following courses:

FIN 6030 Quantitative Models for Decision Makers – Tuesdays, 7:45pm-9:30pm
FIN 6040 Financial Modeling – Wednesdays, 5:30pm – 7:30pm
ECON 5110 Econometrics – offered Summer, 2026

After completing their bachelor's degree, students continue seamlessly to complete the remaining 24 credits for the M.S. in Finance at a heavily discounted tuition rate of \$24,000, regardless of how many Pathways courses were taken.

PREPARATORY COURSEWORK

Due to the rigor of the program, there are some preparatory courses recommended for all students. All students should have taken a calculus course as well as a statistics course which covers linear regression. Additionally, basic experience with one programming language is required. Syms Finance Majors are strongly encouraged to take IDS 1300 1300 and IDS 2030. Students new to Finance are asked to complete Wharton's Fundamentals of Finance course on Coursera.

ABOUT THE M.S. IN FINANCE

The 30-credit M.S. in Finance is an in-person degree program held on the Beren campus. The program's STEM designation signals to employers the rigor and high standards embedded in the curriculum. Students aiming for banking, asset management or other corporate finance jobs will gain knowledge, experience and confidence to lead in the corporate environment.
